## Scholarship Program 2022-2023 Briefing Document and Checklist

Annually, the Association of International Energy Negotiators (AIEN), formerly known as [AIPN](#), sponsors a scholarship awarded to students who demonstrate strong character, academic ability, and potential to make a significant contribution to the field of international energy negotiations. This scholarship has been created in honor of one of AIEN's founding members, Mr. Gordon Barrows.

Award: US\$2,000 annual (US\$1,000 for each consecutive semester) for tuition only, paid directly to the school.

### To qualify, applicants must:

- Possess potential to make a significant contribution to the field of international energy negotiations
- Exhibit academic, leadership, and negotiation ability
- Exhibit financial need
- Complete all parts of the application form and submit all required supporting materials (including a personal statement (to be no greater than 250 words) as to why the applicant should receive the scholarship)
- Submit two (2) letters of recommendation and the "AIEN Reference Letter" forms, from individuals who can speak from personal knowledge concerning the applicant's character, ability, and potential to make a significant contribution to the field of international oil and gas negotiations. **Please note:** One reference **MUST** be from a professor at your school.
- Deliver all necessary forms in one e-mail to AIEN by April 26, 2022. Applications received after this date or incomplete applications will not be considered.

*The selection of the recipients will be at the sole discretion of the AIEN. The AIEN reserves the right to award up to 10 scholarships or none at all. Previous scholarship winners are not eligible to participate again.*

**Applicants will be notified of results on or around June 8, 2022.**

- The completed application
- Copy of your current school transcript
- Copy of entrance exam scores (US schools only)
- Proof of enrollment for Spring 2022 (Students graduating in Fall 2022 are eligible to apply, however it is at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee to award full or partial funds.)
- High resolution JPEG (300dpi) headshot style photo (Scholarship recipients will be featured in the AIEN *Advisor* newsletter.)
- Two letters of recommendation and the "AIEN Reference Letter" forms (not to be included with your application, transcript, and exam scores, but sent to AIEN directly by your reference by mail or e-mail)
